- ³ FR0105 Introduction to French : Complete Beginners is only available to complete beginners and FR1005 French for Near Beginners is not available to any student who took French beyond JC or equivalent.
- ⁴ GE0003 German Language (Beginner Level A1) Part 1 and GE0004 German Language (Beginner Level A1) Part 2 must be taken together. GE0005 German Language (CEFR-Level A2.1) and GE0008 German Language (CEFR-Level A2.2) must be taken together.
- ⁵ Please note HS0028 Spanish Language (Beginner Level) (Beginners A1).
- ⁶ Students who took SC3058 Sociology of Memory, Trauma & Collective Denial, SC3058 Sociology of Memory, Trauma & Collective Denial CR2002 Women, Confinement and Social Control in Ireland or CR2003 Crime, Urbanization and Cities in Second Year cannot select the same module in Third Year.
- ⁷ FR0105 Introduction to French : Complete Beginners (Complete Beginners)and/or FR1005 French for Near Beginners (False beginners), FR1105 Threshold French and/or FR1107 French for Reading Purposes I are only available to students who have not already taken those French modules in Second Year.
