

# LLM (ENVIRONMENTAL AND NATURAL RESOURCES LAW)

## Programme Requirements

**Full-time:** Students take **90** credits over one calendar year.

**Part-time:** Students take **90** credits over two calendar years, completing a total of **40** credits (including a minimum of **25** credits of core modules) in Year 1 and **50** credits in Year 2 (including LW6652 and LW6659 and any core modules not already taken in Year 1).
