Overview

NFQ Level 9, Major Award

The MA (Classical Studies) is a full-time programme running for 12 months or a part-time programme running for 24 months from the date of first registration for the programme.

Exit Award: Postgraduate Certificate in Classical Studies

MA candidates who pass 30 credits of taught modules from Part I may choose to exit the programme and be awarded a Postgraduate Certificate in Classical Studies (https://ucc-ie-public.courseleaf.com/programmes/pccls/). A student who subsequently applies to continue to a Master's must do so within 5 years of successful completion of the Postgraduate Certificate.
