

# MA (THE IRISH REVOLUTION, 1912-1923)

## Overview

### NFQ Level 9, Major Award

The MA (Irish Revolution 1912 - 1923) is a full-time programme taken over 12 months or part-time taken over 24 months from the date of first registration for the programme.

Students take modules to the value of **90** credits comprising taught modules to the value of **45** credits (Part I) and a dissertation to the value of **45** credits (Part II).

## Postgraduate Certificate in the Irish Revolution 1912-1923

Candidates who pass at least 30 credits of taught modules may opt to exit the programme and be awarded a Postgraduate Certificate in the Irish Revolution 1912-1923. (<https://ucc-ie-public.courseleaf.com/programmes/pcirv/>)

- Judge the value of the source material available for the study of this period;
- Assess the contribution of the work of specific historians to our understating of the 'revolutionary decade'.
