The MA (Medieval History) is a full-time, taught programme running for 12 months or part-time over 24 months from the date of first registration for the programmes.

Students take modules to the value of 90 credits comprising of taught modules to the value of 45 credits (Part I) and a dissertation to the value of 45 credits (Part II).
