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On successful completion Postgraduate Diploma in Allergy and Clinical Immunology (<https://ucc-ie-public.courseleaf.com/programmes/pdaci/>), students will be offered the opportunity to progress to the MSc (Allergy and Clinical Immunology).

The MSc (Allergy and immunology) is a part-time programme that runs online over 3 academic years (27 months) from the date of first registration for the programme. Students take modules to a total value of **90** credits in the 3 years. In the last academic year students undertake a research dissertation (30 credits) which is submitted at the end of the academic year.

All students will be registered for the Postgraduate Certificate in Allergy and Clinical Immunology (<https://ucc-ie-public.courseleaf.com/programmes/pcaci/>) in the first instance and will be conferred with the Postgraduate Certificate upon passing modules to the value of 30 credits.
